Broadband Cost Reduction Regulations: Single Information Point (SIP)

Information Notice

Reference:ComReg 16/92Date:19 October 2016

- The Broadband Cost Reduction Regulations ("the Regulations")¹ became effective on 20 July 2016 and implements Directive 2014/61/EU² in Ireland. The primary purpose of the Regulations is to put in place a framework of rights and obligations aimed at facilitating and reducing the cost of deploying high-speed public communications networks ultimately to the benefit of businesses and consumers.
- Regulation 10(1) of the Regulations sets out the functions of the Commission for Communications Regulation ("ComReg"). These include the function of acting as a Single Information Point ("SIP") as set out at Regulation 10(1)(c) of the Regulations:
 - "10(1)(c) The regulator shall carry out [...] the functions of the single information point "..." regarding access to information provided to the single information point by network operators and to facilitate access via a single information point to information regarding statutory permits for civil works required to develop elements of a highspeed electronic communications network including, where appropriate, exempted development provisions and the conditions and procedures applicable to granting a statutory permit."
- 3. The SIP will facilitate access to relevant information regarding:
 - i. permits, licenses or consents for civil works required to develop elements of a high-speed electronic communications network; and
 - ii. the procedures applicable to granting permits, licenses or consents.
- 4. Information provided to ComReg which is within the scope of the SIP (i.e. regarding permits for civil works or information regarding civil works) may be made available subject to a request.
