2: Meeting Minutes

Item:	Meeting Minutes and Actions:
1	Barbara Delaney opened the meeting. Market Trends – Latest Quarterly Report Ivor Kelly presented an update on the fixed, mobile and broadband markets with data up to Q3 2016. Questions raised by the panel were addressed by both Ivor and Eric Tomkins.
2	ComReg ECS Strategy Statement – Consultation Sinead Kelleher presented the draft electronic communications sector strategy statement 2017 -2019. The deadline of 17th February 2017 for receipt of submissions to the consultation process was confirmed.
3	Mobile and Broadband Taskforce ComReg presented an update on the recommendations of the Mobile and Broadband Taskforce report that correlate with the actions identified by ComReg through its strategic analysis.
4	Retail Policy and Compliance Update Therese Hourigan provided an update on the Battery Back Up consultation and Consumer Line statistics Q4 2016.
