Notes for Applicants

Before making an application to ComReg, applicants must be in possession of a Frequency Assignment Document from The Irish Aviation Authority (IAA) in respect of the system, or combination of systems in question.

- 1. The Commission for Communications Regulation's (ComReg) will issue An Air Traffic Services licence in respect of a system, or combination of systems, not installed on aircraft, that use aeronautical frequencies (excluding Aeronautical Radionavigation and Radiolocation) which is/are owned and operated by a single entity.
- 2. Prior to completing an application, applicants are advised to read Document ComReg 11/07 Radiodetermination, Air Traffic and Maritime services Licence Guidelines.
- 3. Before applying to ComReg, all applicants must contact the IAA to obtain a Frequency Assignment Document. This document must accompany all Air Traffic Services applications to ComReg.

N.B. IAA frequency assignments are conditional on the applicant applying to ComReg for a Wireless Telegraphy licence within 30 days of the receipt of the assignment and are considered invalid after 30 days if an application is not received by ComReg.

- 4. The IAA Frequency Assignment Document will be inserted as Part 2 of the ComReg Wireless Telegraphy licence.
- 5. An application cannot be processed until ComReg has received a complete application. To submit a valid application, it is necessary to:
 - complete all sections of the Application Form
 - attach the Frequency Assignment document as obtained from the IAA, and
 - submit the full licence fee with the application
- 6. All new Air Traffic Services Licence shall incur a fee of €500. Licence Amendments shall incur a fee of €30

It should be noted that it is an offence under Section 3 of the "Wireless Telegraphy Act, 1926" to hold wireless telegraphy apparatus without an appropriate licence and such apparatus must not be acquired on the assumption that a licence will be granted.
