

1. Apply for a Licence


3. Introduction

Read the introduction and when ready, hit "next" to proceed.

 $Business\ Radio\ (also\ known\ as\ PMR)\ remains\ a\ popular\ communication\ system\ for\ applications\ where\ most\ traffic\ is\ between$ a control point and one or more mobile terminals, or where groups of mobile terminals need to communicate on a "one to all" basis. The main uses of business radio are for public safety and security, industrial and commercial users such as taxis and couriers, as well as voluntary organisations, all of whom need reliable means of communicating with personnel and, in particular, those on the move. Spectrum for PMR Systems is allocated from parts of the following frequency bands: BAND FREQUENCY (MHz) VHF LOW 68 - 87.5 VHF HIGH 163 - 174 UHF 450 - 470 Further details of the licensing regime can be found in our guidelines document - Guidelines for Business Radio Licences - 00/07aR1. The Regulations governing the issue of Business Radio licences is the Wireless Telegraphy (Business Radio Licence) regulations, 1949 and subsequent amendments. Previous Next



5. General Info

Choose to submit a new application or amend an existing licence.

Check that your contact information is correct. Amend the information if it needs to be updated.




If you want to amend an existing licence, then you will be prompted to select the relevant licence which needs to be amended. You will then be able to select the changes you wish to make to the licence.

Click next when you are ready to proceed. For licence amendments, you will be brought to the fee payments page.

6. Equipment

If the applicant inserts a number greater than one in the base stations/fixed mobiles box, the applicant will be asked to fill out the base stations section later on in the application.


If the base station box is 0, the base station section will disappear from the application when you click next.



7. Coverage:


The applicant will have three options.

If the applicant selects "Onsite" or "User defined" the applicant can click next




If the applicant selects region, the applicant will need to select additional information and provide a justification for selecting a region.

All fields are mandatory so the applicant cannot proceed until this is completed.




8. Channels

If one channel is requested, the applicant can proceed to the next page.



If two or more channels are required the applicant will need to provide additional information. If the applicant selects yes to "are any of these channels for use on a back to back system", the applicant will be asked to fill out the back to back systems section of the application as well as the base stations.

If the applicant selects no, the back to back systems will disappear from the form but the base station section will still remain.



9.0 Base Station

If the application has base stations, the applicant should follow the base station steps. If there are no base stations proceed to section 10.


If the applicant has one or more base stations as well as back to back system, the applicant will need to follow the steps in section 9 and section 10 of this document.

If there is more than one base station you will need to fill out page 1 (site details) and page 2 (frequency & equipment) of the base station section multiple times.

9.1 Base Station (Site Details)

Coordinates must be in degrees second's and minutes. The applicant should click the "show on map" button once the coordinates are enter in the application form to make sure that the location is correct.

If the application contains more than one base station and more than one channel, the applicant will need to define the number of channels for each base station.



Note: If you select user defined for the area of operations the applicant will need to define the coverage distance (2km-35km).


If the applicant select region a sample map will not be provided.

10. Back to Back Systems

If the application has one or more base stations, the applicant should follow the base station steps in section 9 of this document.

10.1 Back to Back Systems (Site Details)

Coordinates must be in degrees second's and minutes. The applicant should click the "show on map" button once the coordinates are enter in the application form to make sure that the location is correct.




Note: If you select user defined for the area of operations the applicant will need to define the coverage distance. (2km-35km)

If the applicant select region a sample map will not be provided.


10.2 Back to Back Systems (Frequency & Equipment)

If the applicant is unsure about anything in this section they can click the blue circles which will provide more information ().




If the applicant has two or more channels all sections must be completed before clicking the next button.




11. Summary
