Notes for Applicants

- 1. In accordance with the Wireless Telegraphy Act 1926, an appropriate licence must be held to permit possession or use of radio equipment. Possession or use of radio equipment without a licence is an offence which renders the offender liable to prosecution and, on conviction, fines and confiscation of equipment.
- 2. The licensing of radio link systems is governed by the Wireless Telegraphy (Radio Link Licence) Regulations, Statutory Instruments No. 319 of 1992 ("the Regulations"). Please note that the Regulations should be read in light of the Common Regulatory Framework for Electronic Communications Networks and Services.
- 3. Licences to keep and have possession of apparatus for wireless telegraphy for fixed point to point radio links are issued by the Commission for Communications Regulation (ComReg).
- 4. Prior to submitting an application form, applicants are advised to read ComReg's *Revised Guidelines to Applicants for Radio Links Point to Point* (ComReg document 98/14R6¹, as revised) ("Revised Guidelines"). In particular, applicants should note the minimum technical requirements that must be met when applying for a radio link licence.
- 5. To complete the application form, it is necessary that:
 - All sections of this application form are completed in full and be legible (i.e. typed or completed in Block Capitals);
 - All technical information submitted complies with the minimum technical requirements set out in the Revised Guidelines;
 - The path calculation information for each radio link is attached to this application from;
 - The link licence application file (*.anx file) is electronically submitted to links.anx@comreg.ie, quoting its unique reference to this application form;
 - A hardcopy printout of the excel sheet used to create the *.anx file is submitted with this application form;
 - The declaration form is signed.

Total fees should be enclosed with the application form. i.e. The application processing fee (\leq 12 per link) <u>plus</u> the licence fee² per link.

- 6. ComReg may request additional information regarding an application.
- 7. ComReg will endeavour to process applications quickly and accommodate each applicant's requirements. However, it should be appreciated that this may not be possible in all cases.
