Digiweb's failure to provide information requested

ComReg issues a Notice of Intention to Prosecute to Digiweb for failure to provide information required by ComReg.

Under Section 13(D) of the Communications Regulation Acts 2002 to 2011, ComReg may at any time, by notice in writing, require an undertaking to provide it with such written information as it considers necessary to enable it to carry out its functions.

ComReg opened an investigation on 18 September 2014 after Digiweb did not provide the information which it was required to provide to ComReg before 12 September 2014 as part of the FACO and Transit Market Analysis.

Following the investigation, ComReg has today given a Notice of Intention to Prosecute to Digiweb, pursuant to Section 44 of Communications Regulation Acts 2002 to 2011 in respect of the alleged offence.

If, within 21 days of the date on which this notice is given, Digiweb, as far as is practicable, remedies to the satisfaction of the Commission the matter giving rise to the alleged offence and pays to the Commission €1,500, accompanied by this notice, Digiweb will not be prosecuted for the alleged offence.

ComReg will continue to monitor the compliance of other operators with Section 13(D) and will take appropriate action as necessary.
