## ODTR approves An Post's request for interim standard price increase of 3 cents

Following a consultation on the subject, the ODTR today (Thursday $28^{\text {th }}$ March 2002) approved An Post's proposal to increase the basic price to deliver a letter anywhere in Ireland or Britain by 3c to 41c. The new price covers all POP letters ${ }^{1}$ up to 50 g as compared with 25 g at present. The cumulative effect of this is that the price of the stamp would be reduced for about $10 \%$ of all letters. The date of implementation is a matter for An Post but customers should be clearly informed beforehand.

There were 31 responses to the consultation. While many respondents were critical of An Post, there was a general recognition that after a long period of stability, some increase was justified.

An Post proposals in respect of Direct Mail Services such as Postaim were the subject of most criticism, on the grounds that annual budgets are already fixed for many organisations using these services and that the overall increase could be very substantial, in particular due to the removal of cumulative discount. The regulator has therefore deferred making a decision pending further review, allowing only the interim flat rate increase of 3c on these services.

With respect to the "Early Presentation Scheme" for bulk mail which gives a discount of 3c to large customers who present their mail before midday - the ODTR has approved these proposals. It is no longer necessary to all have to be identical, and customers can also now frank this post as opposed to paying by cash or cheque.

[^0]The ODTR is concerned that respondents do not consider that the 'early presentation' discounts will be sufficiently attractive to generate a significant switch of business to this service. However, An Post has assured the Director that it intends to promote the new service aggressively in order to achieve the target of $25 \%$ of all mail being handled in this way.

The Regulator will further review An Post's pricing in the light of full separated accounts required by the ODTR ${ }^{2}$ not later than 31 May 2002. With regard to the specific proposal by An Post to increase the price of a basic letter to 45 c , Etain Doyle commented "This is not under consideration at the present time, but is An Post's declared target. I have not yet seen any financial information that would support such a price and look forward to receiving the detailed accounts from An Post at the end of May. The "interim" figure of 41 c is the most that could be supported on the basis of the information that is currently available."

## Postal Regulation is new so it may be helpful to clarify some points

- The regulatory role of the ODTR relates to the postal services not to the whole of An Post's business. In particular issues regarding the funding of post offices network, are a matte for An Post and the Government
- The reserved area currently includes the collection/delivery of all letters weighing less than 350 g and charged at less than $€ 1.90$ (The $€ 1.90$ limit

[^1]will be increased automatically to $€ 2.05$ as a result of the approved increases).

- Proposals currently being considered by the European Parliament propose a reduction in the size of the reserved area to 100 g from $2003,50 \mathrm{~g}$ from 2006 with full competition from 2009.
